



SAME-DAY REGISTRATION

How to register to vote on Election Day in Wisconsin

If you wish to register to vote on Election Day, you must complete a **voter registration application** (provided at the polling place), provide **proof of identification**, and provide **proof of residence** at your polling place.

1. Complete a [voter registration application](#). (click [here](#) for fillable version)

If your name does not appear on the voter list at your polling place, you must complete a voter registration application before you will be allowed to vote.

2. Provide your driver's license number*

*If you have not been issued a driver's license, you can:

Provide a **state-issued identification card number**,

OR

Provide the **last four (4) digits of your social security number** (you CANNOT use this option in place of your driver's license number if you possess a Wisconsin driver's license.)

*If you have a current, valid Wisconsin driver's license but do not know the number and did not bring it to the polling place, you are allowed to vote by **provisional ballot**. Your provisional ballot will not be counted until you:*

- a) bring your driver's license number to your polling place before the polls close at 8:00PM on Election Day; or
- b) transmit (via fax, email, telephone call or personal visit) your driver's license number to [your municipal clerk](#) before 4:00 pm on the day after the Election.

3. Provide **proof of residence*** indicating that you have lived at your current address for at least 10 days preceding the election.

The following constitute acceptable forms of **proof of residence** for purposes of voter registration:

- A current and valid WI driver's license.
- A current and valid Wisconsin identification card.
- Any other official identification card or license issued by a Wisconsin governmental body or unit.
- Any identification card issued by an employer in the normal course of business and bearing a photo of the card holder, but not including a business card.
- A real estate tax bill or receipt for the current year or the year preceding the date of the election.
- A residential lease which is effective for a period that includes election day (NOT for first-time voters registering by mail).
- A university, college or technical institute fee card (must include photo).
- A university, college or technical institute identification card (must include photo).
- A gas, electric or telephone service statement (utility bill) for the period commencing not earlier than 90 days before election day.
- Bank statement.
- Pay check.
- A check or other document issued by unit of government.

Proof of residence does not include any piece of mail addressed to the voter.

*If you cannot supply acceptable Proof-of-Residence, your registration form can be substantiated and signed by one other elector who resides in your municipality, corroborating your residency information. The corroborator must then provide acceptable Proof-of-Residence.
